Dec 2015 Meeting Minutes Continued

Old Business None

New Business

Martin Palmaz briefed us on the insurance situation. Commercial flying schools are no longer covered and site insurance will probably be terminated soon as well. The Risk Retention Group (RRG) is the best option for restoring coverage. Claims have increased, putting sites, schools and instructors at risk. Landing on vehicles and other property is a common cause of claims. USHPA needs to raise \$2M by March 1st 2016, at which time the existing policies expire. If that happens, all regulated sites will be shut down. Risks will need to be managed for self-insurance to work. The RRG will evaluate the risk management plan for each site.

The total to be raised from the membership would be realized if every member donated \$100. He noted that donations are tax deductible and that some employers will match contributions. If the RRG is not created, the deductions will be refunded, but the tax write-offs will then no longer be valid.

Investors in the RRG are also needed. The minimum investment is \$10K.

Pilot and site insurance policies cannot be used for instruction. Flight schools will need to provide insurance for landowners.

A motion was made for WOR to match 50% of donations from members, up to a limit of \$5K. Don Herrick noted that to donate that amount without undue risk, the club should eliminate the budget items for door prizes and parties. With that proviso, the motion was approved.

Ideas for fund raisers were discussed, including a Silent Airshow or a Free Flight Film Festival. Robert Booth solicited other ideas from the membership. Joe Wyffels offered to donate \$1K if the \$10K total needed to meet the club's maximum of \$5K is met.
