There was an incident on the 600' launch in which a hang glider rolled on its wheels into the rocks below launch.

There also was incident resulting from a stall and spin of a Mark IV resulting in the glider impacting the hill near the 600' launch.

Ed Levin: Phyl Hamby

The county has regulations that restrict taking of pictures for profit in the park. Road repairs

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are planned for 2013. New wind socks have been installed.

Mission Ridge: Roy Spencer by e-mail; essentially the same report was presented at the meeting.

There are 10 things I want to remind every key holder.

- 1. Please fly conservatively and safely at Mission. We had no significant accidents last year. A good safety record helps us to keep our flying access at Mission.
- 2. Pilots flying at Mission must be current members of the WOR with the exception of visiting pilots that have obtained a visiting pilot sticker.
- 3. Please make sure to properly lock the gate to the preserve. Tug the handle to make sure the lock is through both holes. Instruct your driver to tug the handle every time.
- 4. Only qualified WOR pilots and your driver are allowed to travel in your vehicle inside the preserve. Do not pick up hikers no matter how cute or cold they might be.
- 5. You must have your vehicle in 4-wheel drive at all times inside the preserve.
- 6. Please renew your WOR membership in December.
- 7. Please submit your complete Mission key application in January.
- 8. Your key application must include the car insurance pages that show your name, your vehicle description, policy date, and the liability amount.
- 9. Your key application status will be posted on the WOR bulletin board. You do not need to send me an e-mail. You do not need to send me an e-mail to apologize for sending me an e-mail.
- 10. Thank you for getting your application in on time and for the good safety record this past year.

Roy also noted that there were 900 sign-ins within 6

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the past year. The web-cam still needs a suitable location. Doug Hahn is organizing the effort to get it up and running again and distributed a url at the meeting that will be its web address.

Mount Diablo: Robert Moore by e-mail

The Diablo windtalker CPU has been removed and is with Litek for repairs. They have yet to determine if it can be repaired; we may have to find an alternative device.
