Walter flew Chelan and King; went 68 miles at King, reaching 14000' and staying in the air for 3 hours, 43 minutes, all personal bests. He also took 3rd in the recreational class in the King meet and landed at a private airport.

Wayne Michelson also went to King; won one day's competition with a 60 mile flight. The competitors flew 5 days of the 6 scheduled.

Paul Gazis went to Lakeview and flew Hadley, reaching 1000' over launch after nearly leaving due to the apparently unpromising conditions.

Treasurer: Don Herrick

Income exceeded expenses for the past month.

Flight Director: Karl Allmandinger

There have been no incidents to report, although some scary stuff has been happening.

Membership Services: Phyl Hamby

There are now 354 paid members, with 2 applications pending.

Ed Levin: Phyl Hamby

Cows are currently grazing in the LZ. The LZ will be mowed once the cows are moved. A gate was left open. This particular gate is not one used in flight operations. Some cows got loose and got onto the green.

Mission Ridge: Roy Spencer

Due to the unusually unstable weather conditions we have had recently, some people have been getting good flights at Mission. The air has been swirlbulent but fun.

I have received two reports of our lock being improperly locked at the back gate in the past two weeks. Please make sure to tug on the handle to ensure the lock is properly engaged.

Alan Deikman said that his house has a view of the windsock and he could host the webcam. Alan also questioned proposed changes to the site procedures.

Coyote Lake: Jim Woodward

Jim and Gene Pfifer met with parks officials. The Parks Dept has changed insurance companies. The new company wants \$7K to insure the site, in addition to the USHPA insurance policy. The insurance company chosen by the Parks Dept wants a \$5M limit. The limit on the USHPA policy is \$1M. It was suggested that Mark Forbes at the USHPA should be involved in discussions with the Parks.

Old Business

Don Herrick stated that projects could be funded and has posted a list of proposed projects on the discussion board. Some good ideas have been submitted including a glider storage facility at Ed Levin and tables and bleachers for Ed Levin.

New Business

Phyl Hamby reported that a 40' storage container can be bought for \$2900 or rented for \$75/month. Fellow Feathers has storage in their clubhouse. Glider storage could be in individually lockable tubes. Wayne Michelson suggested contacting other clubs to find out how they manage their glider storage.

Phyl also proposed installation of a porta potty at the top launch at Ed Levin. He mentioned that it could be mounted on a concrete pad to prevent it from blowing away. There is a \$40 drop fee and maintenance fee of \$90/month.

Wayne Michelson mentioned that he used a spot locator at King Mt. The spot locator reports its position via satellite link every 10 minutes. It costs \$150 and communicates by sending text messages. He and USHPA highly recommend the spot.
